



The local church has a spiritual, ethical and legal responsibility to protect children and vulnerable adults in its faith community.

The Adventist Church Child & Vulnerable Persons Protection Policy emphasises that certain church officers should complete safeguarding requirements. These officers are:

- Persons working/volunteering in child-related roles
- Church Board members regardless of position held

The safeguarding requirements are:

- Cleared Working with Children Check (or equivalent) as relevant to your local jurisdiction
- Completion of the Awareness Training via the Adsafe eLearning portal (link below) or a live Zoom session delivered by Adsafe
- Signing of the Child and Vulnerable Adult Code of Conduct via the Adsafe eLearning portal

National Principles for Child Safe Organisations



Child safety and wellbeing is embedded in organisational leadership, governance and culture.



Processes to respond to complaints and concerns are child focused.



Children and young people are informed about their rights, participate in decisions affecting them and are taken seriously.



Staff and volunteers are equipped with the knowledge, skills and awareness to keep children and young people safe through ongoing education and training.



Families and communities are informed, and involved in promoting child safety and wellbeing.



Physical and online environments promote safety and wellbeing while minimising the opportunity for children and young people to be harmed.



Equity is upheld and diverse needs respected in policy and practice.



Implementation of the national child safe principles is regularly reviewed and improved.



People working with children and young people are suitable and supported to reflect child safety and wellbeing values in practice.



Policies and procedures document how the organisation is safe for children and young people.
